PawsForward runs entirely on your donations. Donations cover: veterinary services, grooming, food, training supplies and materials. Help us keep this unique program alive with your donations and support.



Traditionally a guide dog student would leave their home and attend a school to learn effective handling and safety techniques for working with their new companion. Like these organizations, OccuPaws raises, trains and places the guide dogs, but unlike the others, our teaching takes place in the student's home town. Because the student learns at home, they have a personalized experience and are instructed in the best ways to work with their dog in all their life circumstances.

About guide dogs

Guide dogs become the "eyes" of a visually impaired person. Dogs are trained to help their companion in the following ways:

- Avoiding stationary and moving objects while walking or traveling
- Navigating pedestrian traffic
- Stopping for changes in elevations like curbs and stairs
- Helping their companion cross the street safely
- Promoting independence and mobility
- Providing companionship
- Assisting in location of elevators, stairs and exits in buildings in new environments.
